### **PERSONAL TESTIMONY**

My 1<sup>st</sup> drink in Nepal – from a bottle of “GURU MAHARAJI – **FAMILY Life** – PURIFIED DRINKING WATER”

- What a way to confirm this trip, being a member of COOS Family Life Ministry!

It took a while to sink in, from the experience, witnessing the work of God for healing and deliverance, as well as having the multitude (at rallies) to hear God's message. Deliverance taking place without the laying of hand, where a lady was slained and evil spirit driven out of her, delivered (Alicia – at Tangia Basti).

- Witnessing people with difficulty walking and testifying that they can now walk was tremendous.
- Dumb spoke, calling out name of son! (Chris)
- Hearing restored. (Chris – at Birgunj airport)
- Eyesight improved! (Frankie – at Birgunj airport)
- Deliverance at Birgunj seminar of woman with totally 'black face'. (Frankie)

- Praying for many people with all kinds of sickness, young and old. (All)
- Spiritual Fathers' and Mothers' hug to affirm God the Father's love. (All)

Kathmandu – was really expecting something good, but, it was really bad!

- Surrounding the old palace, which is now a museum, it really reflected more of a slum.
- People in the villages wearing dirty and worn out clothing, it gave me a different perspective of 'give old clothes to the poor new meaning!'

Oh, we are so blessed in Singapore! Perhaps this is what Jesus really meant when He says, go out to the world, otherwise we are just living in part of a dream; that the world cannot be too different from ours.

### **WHAT IS GOD TEACHING ME** (Positive Feedback on this trip)

1. It's not about me. It's all about God!
2. I am ready to preach the good news.
3. God can use me.
4. Witnessing and experiencing 1<sup>st</sup> hand, the power of God.
5. Multitudes are waiting to hear the good news.
6. People want to get healed.
7. Some are ready to receive Jesus as Lord and Saviour.
8. Some are not, but we have made the good news available, the seeds have been planted; someone else will water it later.
9. I am co-heir with Christ, I have Spiritual Authority in the name of Jesus!
10. There are workers out there waiting to be better equipped.
11. Work among Christian brothers and sisters whom I am not too familiar; both from the team and from Nepal.
12. During preaching at church on Saturday, one of the verse, Rev 3:20 which was planned to quote, was found on a poster right behind me in the church. That's God presence!  
Always near, never far!
13. Alicia and I started the Spiritual father / mother hugs with the congregation and there were release of hurts and disappointments, rejection, abuse, etc. We can bring healing and comfort to people.

### **CHALLENGES**

1. To identify specific needs so that the right training at the right pace and sufficient details to meet respective needs.
2. Be very focused on the objective. As scripture reminds us in

2 Cor 10:3-6 (NIV)

3 For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does.

4 The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds.

5 We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ. 6 And we will be ready to punish every act of disobedience, once your obedience is complete.

Be UNITED together fighting spiritual warfare, everyone must be focused at the task at hand and therefore prevent the devil from having a foothold.

3. Debrief and feedback – on a daily basis if possible in the mission field.
  - a. Important to reflect on what can improve, and thereby strengthening every member.
  - b. As team, we must be open to new ideas and thoughts (others' ideas and thoughts).
    - i. As the body of Christ, each of us have different gifts.
    - ii. Each of us have useful gifts to share.
    - iii. As followers, leaders, teachers, we must be willing to continuously learning.
    - iv. No one idea is a bad idea.
    - v. Our focus is on Jesus Christ – every pretension that sets itself against the knowledge of God is sin (2Cor 10:5) – so we are focus on constructive feedback, not personal agenda.
  - c. I am reminded of Romans 8:15 as we taught in the TMC session on Saturday, 18<sup>th</sup> April.

15 For you did not receive a spirit that makes you a slave again to fear, but you received the Spirit of sonship.

    - We have received the Spirit of sonship!

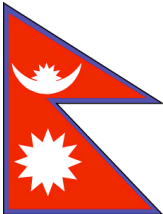
